PRAYER

The Speaker, (Mr. Lenamarle Stephen): Hon. Members it is notified THAT the Speaker has approved the following requests for Statements today Tuesday October 7th at 2:30 p.m. pursuant to Standing Order 47/1 Statement No. 013/2025 requested by Hon. Stacy Nareyo MCA special elected to the Chairperson of Sectoral Committee on Public Works Roads and Transport regarding the current state of the Milimani- Yamo road in Maralal ward.

Specially Elected MCA, (Hon. Stacy Nareyo): Thank you Mr. Speaker, Pursuant to Standing Order No. 47 I rise to request a Statement from the chairperson of Sectorial Committee of Public Works Roads and Transport regarding the current state of the Milimani- Yamo road in Maralal ward. It has come to the attention of the public and this House that the contractor who is undertaking piping works from Yamo dam a national government project has extensively damaged the Milimani-Yamo road during the course of the works.

The roads which serves as the critical access routes for the residents of Milimani and the surrounding areas has become nearly impassable especially during the rainy season. In addition along the same road the contractor has also destroyed the household's water connecting pipes that supply families with water from the Milimani main borehole resulting in the interruption of access to clean and safe water for several homes this has caused untold suffering and inconvenienced to the residents who now lack basic essential service.

This situation Mr. Speaker raise a serious concern about inter-agency coordination protection of public infrastructure and essential services and the need for enforcement of restoration and compensation obligation where public and community assets are damaged by third party projects including those that are implemented by national government. Mr. Speaker Section 102 c of the County Government Act 2012 requires counties to promote efficient resource use and infrastructure development including protection of public assets.

Secondly, Article 1/2 c of the Constitution emphasizes good governance transparency and accountability in public affairs including the management of infrastructure and delivery of essential services. Section 57 of Physical and Land Use Planning Act 2019 requires any Public and Private Project's affecting land or infrastructure to obtain development permission and adhere to the planning and regulations including mitigation of negative impacts.

The Environmental Management and Coordination Act (EMCA) 1999 obligates projects implementers to conduct Environmental Impacts Assessment (EIA) and take measures to prevent repair or compensate for environmental and infrastructural damage. Number 5 Mr. Speaker the Public Roads and Roads Access Act Cap 399 provides that any obstruction or destruction of public roads must be rectified and the responsible parties must be held accountable. In the Statement the chairperson should inquire into and report the following

- 1) The identity of the contractor or agency who is undertaking the piping works from the Yamo dam
- 2) Whether the county government was consulted prior to commencement of the works and whether the projects obtained necessary approvals for works affecting county roads and also the local infrastructure
- 3) Whether the contracts includes provisions requiring the restoration of the Milimani Yamo road and repair of the damaged water connection
- 4) What measures the Department of Roads and Water services has taken or planned to make sure the immediate restoration of the road and also the connection of water services to the affected families
- 5) Any steps taken to enforce accountability and secure compensation from the contractor to the affected households for the loss and the disruption caused

Lastly, I will also recommend that the chairperson of the Committee on Public Works to check whether any government agency has taken steps to ensure that all the affected residents are either compensated or assisted to restore their water connections, thank you Mr. Speaker.

The Speaker, (Mr. Lenamarle Stephen): Hon. Lemoosa you are still the chair roads

Chairperson Roads and Public Works Committee, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): yes, thank you Mr. Speaker I think having listened very carefully to the Hon. Member she draws a lot of concern on damages and maybe other destroyed properties and I want to seek patience with the Hon. Member and the community involved and of course we consult the Department and as such level I do request that we bring back the really situation as per request of the Hon. Member on 22nd October, 2025 on Wednesday 2:30 p.m. Mr. Speaker, thank you.

The Speaker, (Mr. Lenamarle Stephen): Hon. Stacy on 22nd?

Specially Elected MCA, (Hon. Stacy Nareyo): Thank you Hon. Speaker, I am okay with that

The Speaker, (Mr. Lenamarle Stephen): Thank you Hon. Lemoosa let us have the response on 22nd and kindly tell the CECM those are the six questions.

Chairperson Roads and Public Works Committee, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): Most obliged Mr. Speaker.

The Speaker, (Mr. Lenamarle Stephen): Thank you Hon. Leitoro I gave out direction but what is the issue?

MCA El-Barta Ward, (Hon. Leitoro Jeremiah): Mr. Speaker, I wanted to bring attention to the House if the Statement that have been raised by the Hon. Member, I thought all the roads that are within municipality of Maralal are under... because it is also the water and the connection of water that have already been destroyed are under municipality so I thought that perhaps maybe you can be able to direct the question to the Department of Lands and Urban Planning, It is just a concern.

The Speaker, (Mr. Lenamarle Stephen): Hon. Stacy Milimani is part of Municipality and therefore the Question will be answered by the Chairman Lands Hon. Leerte.

MCA Porro Ward,(Hon Leerte Ptrick)Mr. Speaker, Milimani is actually within Municipality; the residents from Milimani area are using water from the borehole. Their pipes have been destroyed by the contractors working there at Yamo dam. They destroy people's pipes while digging trenches. We would like your guidance on this matter.

The Speaker, (Mr. Lenamarle Stephen): Thank you. We have our Standing Orders the second schedule and if you look at number 6 on Road, Transport and Public Works and it states that all matters related to County transport including County roads, street lights under traffic and parking under the roads transport and public works. So, it will come back to Hon. Lemoosa because Lands, Housing only deals with the issue of survey and mapping, so Hon. Lemoosa let it fall under the roads.

Chairperson, Committee on Transport, Roads and Public Works, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): Thank you Mr. Speaker. Most obliged. Maybe it needs some consultation within other Departments which we will be most obliged to do, thank you Mr. Speaker.

Majority Leader, (Hon. Loloju Joseph): Thank you Mr. Speaker Sir. I beg to proceed; Article 185 of the Constitution of Kenya 2010 provides that the Legislative authority of a County is vested in its County Assembly. A County Assembly is the power to make laws necessary for the effective discharge of functions under the fourth schedule. Standing Order 173 of the newly revised Standing Orders of the County Assembly of Samburu provides for the reconstitution of the Committee on Selection to enable the nomination of Members to various Assembly Committees.

Pursuant to the direction of the Hon. Speaker, through his communication from the Chair dated 9th September 2025 the Committee on Selection was reconstituted and approved by the House on 16th September 2025.

INTRODUCTION

Mr. Speaker Sir, Pursuant to Standing Order number 171, 172, 174, 175 and 212 and following the Speaker's communication dated 9th September 2025 the Committee on Selection convened a retreat at Eagle Palace hotel in Nakuru from 23rd-25th September 2025. During the retreat the

Committee deliberated comprehensively and nominated Members to serve in the various Select and Sectorial Committees of the County Assembly. The names of the nominated Members are hereby submitted for approval by the House, as detailed below.

The retreat offered a conducive and focused environment that enabled Members to engage in thorough and objective deliberations, with the aim of ensuring fair, inclusive, and balanced representation across all Committees of the County Assembly.

COMMITTEE SITTINGS

Mr. Speaker Sir, the Committee convened sittings during the retreat on 23rd, 24th, and 25th September, 2025. Deliberations were chaired by the Committee Chairperson, Hon. Joseph Loloju and guided by the Office of the Clerk. Secretariat support was provided by officers from the legislative, research, and procedural departments.

Majority leader, (Hon. Loloju Joseph): Summary. In executing its mandate the committee adopted the following criteria:

1. Political party strength and proportionality.
2. Gender balance and inclusion of youth and marginalized groups.
3. Member preferences and professional backgrounds.
4. Regional/ward balancing across the County.

The committees were grouped into sectoral and select committees with each member assigned fairly to ensure active and productive participation. The proposed County Assembly committees are as follows:

 - h) Environment water and natural resources.
 - i) Finance, economic planning and ICT.
 - j) Labour, social welfare justice and legal affairs.
2. Select committees.
 - a) Budget and appropriation committee.
 - b) Public accounts and investment committee.
 - c) Committee on delegated county legislative.
 - d) House business committee.
 - e) Committee on procedures and house rules.
 - f) Committee on powers and privileges.
 - g) Committee on appointments.
 - h) Committee on selection.
 - i) Liaison committee.
 - j) Committee on implementation.

The above committees were clustered into two groups, sectoral committees and select committees. This categorization was aimed at streamlining committee operations, improving attendance, coordination and enhancing overall efficiency and performance in the execution of mandates.

Honorable members, the committee on selection undertook extensive deliberations and upon conclusion duly nominated members to serve in various committees of the county assembly as outlined in the subsequent sections of this report.

Committee recommendations

The committee recommended that the County Assembly adopt the report of the committee on selection under reconstitution and replacement of members in the sectoral and select committees with or without amendments. Further, the committee knows that the number of committees in the Assembly significantly exceeds the available number of members and that the minority party is represented by a small number of members.

Consequently, to ensure proper functionality and quorum in all committees, several members have been nominated to serve in more than two sectoral committees. This arrangement is in line with standing order 174 cap 3 which provides that; except the County Assembly may otherwise resolve on the recommendation of the committee on selection for reasons to be stated, no member shall appointed to serve in more than two sectoral committees and more than special elect committee.

In this regard, the committee recommends that the house resolves to allow this deviation from the standard limit on account of necessity created by the assembly's composition and operational needs. The committee further urges the house to support the recommendations to ensure that all committees remain fully constituted and able to discharge their legislative oversight and representative responsibilities effectively.

Composition of County Assembly committees
