MOTION

MCA, Suguta Marmar Ward, (Hon. Leleruk James): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I have been delected this duty by Hon. Rebecca Lolosoli because she is not feeling well.

Hon. Speaker, **THAT**, Pursuant to the Provisions of the County Assembly of Samburu Standing Order 60; the County Assembly of Samburu approves the Report of the Committee on Public Service and Social Welfare, Justice and Legal Affairs on the consideration of the appointments of Samburu County Village Council Members. I request Hon. Lealmusia to second the Motion.

The Speaker, (Mr. Lenamarle Stephen): Hon. Members, I now propose the Motion, **THAT**, Pursuant to the Provisions of the County Assembly of Samburu Standing Order 60, the County Assembly of Samburu approves the Report of the Committee on Public Service and Administration, Social Welfare, Justice and Legal Affairs on the consideration of the appointees of Samburu County Village Council Members.

MCA, Suguta Marmar Ward, (Hon. Leleruk James): Mr. Speaker, the appointment of Village Council Members was conveyed to the Clerk through a letter dated 7th October 2025 but received on 2nd December 2025 and in accordance with Section 53(1)(b) of the County Governments Act, 2012 and further in accordance with Section 6(1)(b) of the Samburu County Village Unit Delineation Act, 2015, and Standing Order number 200(4)(f) of the County Assembly Standing Orders, the list of names was referred to the Committee on Public Service and Social Welfare, Justice and Legal Affairs for further action and reporting to the House within seven days.

CONSEQUENTLY, and in accordance to Standing Order 215, Public Participation through Petitions, and **FURTHER**, Article 196 of the Constitution, and Section 87 of the County Governments Act, 2012, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed a public notice on 2nd December 2025 inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath affidavit on the criteria used based on gender balance, Majority groups representation.

The Public notice indicated that the submissions were to be received by Monday, 8th December 2025 at 5.00 p.m. By the close of the submission period, the Committee received one Petition from Wamba West Ward. Having conducted scrutiny of the received Petition by the Committee, the following observations were noted from the prayers of the Petitioner;

1. That the Village Administrators had submitted the list to the Ward Administrators, who in turn forwarded it to the County Government.
2. That the County Government has forwarded the final list of the names of the Village Elders for approval by the County Assembly which is different from the list prepared by the Village Administrator in consultation with the residents.
3. That a letter was written by a petitioner to the Village Administrators seeking answers on why there were changes on the final list.
4. That despite the letter there was no response from the Ward Admins or from the County Government on the changes of the list.
5. That the final list as submitted by the County Executive County Secretary to the County Assembly is arbitrary as it does not take into consideration such matters as gender balance or competitive appointments.
6. That from the forwarded list to the County Assembly for approval it is clear that the County Government has discouraged competitive appointment process as well as gender balance by disregarding the initial list prepared as per the residents of each village.
7. That it is important that the will of the people is considered and the list submitted by the County Government containing Village Elders who have not been competitive appointed be disregarded by the County Assembly.

The Petitioner therefore prays;

1. That the County Assembly of Samburu does not approve the list of Village Elders submitted by the County Executive as neither reflects the views and the wishes of the residents of 11 village of Wamba West Ward, nor the Provision of Section 53 of the County Government Act.

2. That the County Assembly disregard the list by the County Executive and summons the Chief of Staff to explain why the initial list containing competitively appointed Village Elders has been changed.
3. That the County Assembly of Samburu requests the County Executive to resubmit the original list containing Village Council Members duly and competitively appointed by Ward Administrator with the president's approval.
4. That any other prayer to be issued by the County Assembly or Committee in the interest of justice to the people of Wamba West Ward

May I take this opportunity to thank all Members of the Committee for their input and valuable contribution time during the deliberation and construction of the memoranda Petitions and Report writing. The committee also take this opportunity to thank the office of the Speaker and the office of the Clerk of the County Assembly of Samburu for technical support accorded to the Committee during this exercise. On behalf of the Committee on Public Service and Administration, Social Welfare, Justice and Legal Affairs, it is my pleasure to present the Report of the Committee on Public Service Administration, Social and Legal Affairs on the consideration of appointment of the nominees to be Members of the Samburu County Village Council.

COMMITTEE OBSERVATION AND FINDINGS

The Committee having considered the list of Village Council Members, it was observed that all the other Wards had no Petitions apart from Wamba West Ward that brought a petition.

Committee recommendations, having considered the list of Village Councils, the Committee recommended as follows;

1. That the Committee anonymously agreed that the list of all wards be approved as they are.
2. That the Committee had a lengthy deliberation on the list of Village Council from all Wards and amicably settled on Petitioners prayers as amended and the new list as attached is comprehensively agreed upon.

3. That the Assembly Adopts the Report.

I raise to contribute to the report of Village Council Members and first of all, I wish to appreciate the good work done by the Committee. We know you had a tight schedule from yesterday. Too big a Report and as you have tried to complete everything, I think you worked like how Chinese work day and night, so you did a good job for that purpose.

Secondly, I also appreciate because as the Petitioner is from my Ward, really the list was altered. The list which was submitted to the Executive by the Village Administrators was changed. And that's why the Petitioner wrote and pleaded to the County Assembly to consider the original. I confirm the attached list is the original list from the Village Administrators and that is a good work because it could have been denying the people of Wamba West their justice of choosing their representative. So that is a good job, the Committee. Thank you so much.

Member, Committee on Public Service and Administration, Social Welfare, Justice and Legal Affairs, (Hon. Leleruk James): Thank you Mr. Speaker.

In accordance with section 58 (A) (7) of the County Government Act, 2012, that provides that there should arise a vacancy in the County Public Service Board, The Governor Shall nominate and, with the approval of the County Assembly, appoint members of the county public service board.

Following the nomination of the County Public Service Board Members by His Excellency the Governor in Accordance with Section 58 (A) (7) of The County Governments Act, 2012, and Pursuant to Section 58(1)(a) of the County Governments Act, 2012, and Pursuant to Articles 235 (1)(a), (b) and (c) of the Constitution of Kenya, 2010, the following persons were nominated:

1. Lindah Lesas - Member, County Public Service Board
2. Marios Letereua – Member, County Public Service Board
3. Jackin Leriye – Member, County Public Service Board

The nomination of the three (3) persons was conveyed to the Clerk through a letter Ref: CGS/OOG/CPSB/SP/Vol.1/003/25 dated 2nd December, 2025. The nominee's Curriculum Vitae and other testimonials were enclosed in the letters.

On 2nd December, 2025 and in accordance with the provision of Section 7(1) of the Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 the Speaker reported the receipt of the

notification to the County Assembly the nomination of the County Public Service Board Members nominees. In Accordance with Section 58(A) (1) of The County Governments (Ammendment) Act, 2020, and pursuant to Section 8(1)(a) of the County Governments Act, 2012 and Standing Order no. 200(4)(f) of County Assembly of Samburu Standing Orders, the names of the nominees were referred to the Committee on Public Service Administration, Social Welfare, Justice And Legal Affairs for vetting and reporting to the House within seven (7) days.

Consequently, and in accordance to Section 7(4) of Public Appointments (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2017, the Clerk of the County Assembly placed a public notice on 2nd December, 2025, inviting the public to submit memoranda by way of written statements on oath (*affidavit*) on the suitability or otherwise of each nominee in accordance with the public Appointments (County Assembly Approval) Act, 2017. The public notice indicated that the submissions were to be received by Monday 8th December, 2025 at 5.00 P.M. By close of the submission period, the Committee did not receive any memoranda touching on the suitability or otherwise of any nominees.

The nominees appeared before the committee as scheduled on Tuesday 9th December, 2025 for approval hearings in accordance with the provisions of the Constitution, County Government Act, 2012, public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017 and the County Assembly of Samburu Standing Orders on their suitability or otherwise for appointment as members to the Samburu County Public Service Board.

Upon interrogation and appearance of the nominees before the Committee, the Committee observed that the following nominees met the integrity threshold; demonstrated knowledge of topical, administrative and technical issues touching on the positions they have been nominated for; and had requisite abilities, academic qualification and professional experience to be approved for appointments;

1. Lindah Lesas - Member, County Public Service Board
2. Marios Letereua – Member, County Public Service Board
3. Jackin Leriye – Member, County Public Service Board

Having conducted the approval hearings for the nominees in accordance with the constitution, County government Act, 2012, Public Appointments (County Assemblies Approval) Act, 2017

and County Assembly of Samburu standing order No. 212(4)(f), the committee recommends that, this Assembly;

1. Approves the nomination of Lindah Lesas, for appointment as Member, Samburu County Public Service Board.
2. Approves the nomination of Marios Letereua, for appointment as, Member Samburu County Public Service Board.
3. Approves the nomination of Jackin Leriye, for appointment as, Member Samburu County Public Service Board.

SAMBURU COUNTY FINANCE BILL, 2025(SAMBURU COUNTY BILL, NO. 3)

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE HOUSE

Chairperson, Committee of The Whole House, (Hon. Lelenkeju Jackson): Hon. Members, we are now calling the House to order. Clerk, proceed

Part one; Preliminary, Short title and commencement.

1. *This Act may be cited as the Samburu County Finance Act 2025 and shall come into operation on the date of publication in Kenya Gazette in accordance with section 133 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012*
2. *(1) In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires- “County” means County Government of Samburu; “Authorized channel” means making payment to the County through an officer appointed by the County to collect revenue or through any other mode of payment as may be prescribed by the County;*
“Cess” means fees charged for goods specified in the Fourth Schedule

Chairperson, Committee of The Whole House, (Hon. Lelenkeju Jackson): Members, I now Propose that clause two (2) be part of the Bill.

Clerk, proceed to read clause three (3)

Part II – Fees, Charges, Licenses/SBP and Cesses

charges

3. *The service listed in the First Schedule shall be charged a fee at rate specified in the last column*

License/Permit 4: (1) A person shall not carry out any business listed in the second schedule within the county without a valid license/permit

(2) A person who intends to carry out any of the listed business listed in the second Schedule shall apply for a license from the County offices

(3) A person applying for license under sub section (ii) shall be charged a fee specified in the Second Schedule depending on the location and size of the business.

(4) A person who contravenes any of the provisions of this section commits an offence.

Fees

5. (1) A person who carries out an activity listed in the Third Schedule shall be charged a fee at the rate set out therein.

(2) A person who carries out listed in the Third Schedule and fails to pay the fee, commits an offence.

“Cess”/ markets fees

6. (1) the goods listed in the fourth Schedule shall be charged cess/markets fees at the rate specified in the Schedule.

(2) A person who fails to pay the cess commits an offence.

Charge

7. The services listed in the Fifth Schedule shall be charged a fee at the rate specified in the last column.

8. (1) a person who carries out an activity listed in the Sixth Schedule shall be charged a fee at the rate set out therein.

(2) A person who carries out an activity listed in the Sixth Schedule and fails to pay the fee, commits an offence.

(1) A person who carries out an activity listed in the Seventh Schedule shall be charged a fee at the rate set out therein.

(2) A person who carries out an activity listed in the Seventh Schedule and fails to pay the fee, commits an offence.

10.

- (1) A person who carries out an activity listed in the Eighth Schedule shall be charged a fee at the rate set out therein.
- (2) (ii) A person who carries out an activity listed in the Eight Schedule and fails to pay the fee, commits an offence.

- (1) A person who carries out an activity listed in the Ninth Schedule shall be charged a fee at the rate set out therein.
- (2) (ii) A person who carries out an activity listed in the Ninth Schedule and fails to pay the fee, commits an offence.

The Executive Member for Finance may amend the schedule

12. (i) the Executive Committee Member responsible for Finance may by order published in the gazette amend any of the Schedules.

(ii) Any order made under sub section (1) shall be laid before the County Assembly without un reasonable delay, and unless a resolution approving the order is passed by the County Assembly within twenty-one days on which the Assembly next sits after the order is so laid, it shall henceforth be void, but without prejudice to anything previously done there under.

Part III – PAYMENT

13. (1) Any payment to the County shall be paid through an authorized channel.

(2) An officer appointed by the County to collect revenue shall have identification card issued by the County.

(3) A County official receipt shall be issued for all payments made to the County.

(4) A person shall not receive or collect any money on behalf of the county unless he has been appointed to do so, or has authority as the receiver and collector of the County revenue.

(5) A person who contravenes the provisions of this Section commits an offence.

PART IV- OFFENCES AND PENALTIES

General Penalty

14. Any person who commits an offence under this Act for which no penalty is provided shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred thousand shillings or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year or both.

Offence by the County

15. A staff of the County or any other person having duty to perform under this Act-

(a) Makes, in any record, or document which they are required to keep or staff of make an entry which they know or have reasonable cause to believe to be false or do not believe to be true;

(b) Willing fully refuses to do anything which they know or have reasonable cause to know is required to be done by them;

(c) Interferes with any other person or process under this Act, so as to defeat the provisions or requirements of this Act:

Where required under this Act to do anything to give effect to the provisions of this Act, fails to do such things;

(e) Without reasonable cause does omit omits to do something in breach of his duty under this Act;

(f) Willfully contravene the provision of this Act to give undue advantage or favor to another person;

(g) fails to prevent or report to the County or any other relevant authority, the commission of an offense committed under this Act, commits an offense and is liable on conviction, to a fine not exceeding one hundred thousand shillings or imprisonment for a term not exceeding one year, or both.

PART V – MISCELLANEOUS

Savings

16. (1) Fees, charges, licenses, rent or rent or “cess” payable to the County at the commencement of this Act, but which are not included in the Schedule to this Act, shall continue to be

chargeable and payable to the County unless they are repealed or County laws on such fees, charges, license, rent or “cess” are enacted.

(2) All directions, resolutions, orders and authorizations on or relating to financial management, including the collection and administration of fees and charges given or issued by the defunct Town or County Council before the commencement of this Act shall be deemed to have been given, issued or made by or under the authority of the County and authorizations, and shall continue, with the necessary modifications, apply to the payment and the administration of fees, charges and the other levies under this Act.

Cessation

(17). The rates for; fees, charges, licenses, “cess” or rent, applicable before the commencement of this Act, for business, activity, goods, or services listed in the schedules, shall cease to apply.

2.205: Hawker with motor vehicle 1 person with motor vehicle; KSh. 5, 000.

2.210: Hawker 1 person without a motor vehicle; KSh. 1, 500.

2.215: Small informal sector trader/service provider shoeshine, shoe repair, street vender (newspaper, sweets, soda, cigarettes); KShs. 1, 000.

2.220: Semi-permanent informal sector trader up to 2 persons operating in veranda or temporary building; KSh. 1, 000.

2.295: Other informal sector; KSh. 1, 000.

2.300: Transport, storage and communication such as; Transportation Co-Operations taxis-buses-lorries- matatu-planes-boats. Driving schools, tour/safari operators, petrol stations, storage, facilities, publishing Co-Newspaper, books, texts, telephone Co, Radio/TV broadcaster and, internet provider.

2.305: *Large Transportation Company over 30 vehicles; KSh. 40, 000.*

2.310: *Medium Transportation Company from 6 to 30 vehicles; KSh. 20, 000.*

2.315: *Small Transportation Company from 2 to 5 vehicles; KSh. 5, 000*

2.320: *Independent Transport Operator 1 vehicle; KSh. 2, 000.*

For Item 2.325, large petrol filling stations with over 60 dispensers or with garages, workshops and retail outlets charges Kenya Shillings 20,000.

For Item 2.330, medium petrol stations with 6 to 60 dispensers, including garages, workshops and retail shops, charges Kenya Shillings 10,000.

For Item 3.35, small petrol stations with garages, workshops or retail outlets charges Kenya Shillings 5,000.

LONG TITLE

The Samburu County Finance Bill, 2025: A Bill for an Act of the County Assembly of Samburu to provide for the imposition or variation of various permit fees, sales, licence fees, rates, rents or charges, or for any other revenue-raising measures of the County Government, and for connected purposes.

MCA Wamba East, (Hon. Lelengeju Jackson): Hon. Members, I propose the Question that the Long Title be part of the Bill.

SHORT TITLE AND COMMENCEMENT

This Act may be cited as the Samburu County Finance Act, 2025, and shall come into operation on the date of its publication in the Kenya Gazette in accordance with Section 133 of the Public Finance Management Act, 2012.
