Temporary Speaker, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): Hon. Members, it notified that the Speaker has approved the following response for statements today Tuesday March, 10th, 2026 at 2:30 p.m., Pursuant to Standing Order 54 (c):

Statement No. 01/2026, requested by Hon. Lenamparasio Phelix (MCA Loosuk Ward) to the Chairperson Committee on Education and Vocational Training regarding the implementation status of bursary fund for the Financial Year 2025/2026. Hon. Lorunyei Lawrence.

IMPLEMENTATION STATUS OF THE COUNTY

BURSARY FUND FOR FY 2025/2026

Chairperson, Committee on Education and Vocational Training, (Hon. Lorunyei Lawrence): Thank you, Hon. Speaker.

Hon. Speaker, I hereby respond to the Statement requested by Hon. Lenamparasio Phelix, (MCA Loosuk Ward) regarding the implementation status of the County Bursary Fund for the Financial Year 2025/2026.

The Department of Education and Vocational Training wishes to respond as follows:

1. Amount Allocated for the County Bursary Fund for the Financial Year 2025/2026

The County Government of Samburu has consistently supported needy and vulnerable learners through the County Bursary Fund administered under the Department of Education and Vocational Training.

In the Financial Year 2024/2025, the County Bursary Fund received a total allocation of KShs. 68,758,637, which was disbursed to secondary school students.

However, in the Fourth Quarter Supplementary Budget for the Financial Year 2024/2025, the County Assembly approved the reallocation of KShs. 30 million from the bursary fund to the health sector to support critical health service delivery needs within the County.

For the Financial Year 2025/2026, the County Assembly approved budgetary provisions under the Department of Education and Vocational Training intended to continue supporting needy learners through bursary assistance across all Wards in the County.

A total of KShs. 98,300,000 was approved. However, the Fund received KShs. 60,200,000 in February 2026.

2. When does the Department Intend to disburse the Bursary Funds

In January 2025, the Office of the Controller of Budget issued a circular advising county governments to suspend the issuance of bursaries directly to individual students due to concerns regarding the legal framework governing such programmes and the need to ensure compliance with public finance management regulations.

The circular further advised county governments to review the operational and legal framework guiding the administration of bursary funds to ensure that such programmes are implemented within the confines of the law and existing financial management regulations.

Following this directive, the County Government of Samburu temporarily suspended the disbursement of bursary funds as it undertook a review of the existing framework guiding the implementation of the programme in order to ensure full compliance with the guidance issued by the Office of the Controller of Budget.

Consequently, the bursary programme for the Financial Year 2025/2026 experienced delays pending the conclusion of the review process and the issuance of further guidance by the relevant oversight institutions.

The ban from the Controller of Budget has since been lifted and the committee is currently in the process of disbursing the bursary funds for the Financial Year 2025/2026.

3. Measures Being Put in Place to Ensure Timely Support to Learners

Despite the current regulatory constraints affecting implementation of the bursary programme, the County Government of Samburu remains fully committed to supporting needy learners across the county.

To address the situation and ensure that support to learners continues in a lawful and transparent manner, the Department is undertaking the following measures: -

- 1. Reviewing the County Bursary Operational Framework to ensure compliance with national public finance management laws and regulations;*
- 2. Engaging oversight institutions, including the Office of the Controller of Budget and other relevant Government agencies, to obtain further guidance on the appropriate structure for supporting learners;*
- 3. Exploring alternative compliant mechanisms through which the County Government can continue supporting vulnerable learners without contravening existing legal and regulatory provisions governing public funds; and*
- 4. Strengthening accountability and transparency mechanisms within the program to ensure that any future implementation aligns with public finance management requirements and oversight standards.*

Upon conclusion of the ongoing consultations and review process, the County Government will provide further guidance on the appropriate framework for implementing educational support programs for needy learners across the county.

The County Government of Samburu reiterates its commitment to improving access to education and supporting vulnerable learners through sustainable and legally compliant mechanisms.

Hon. Speaker, we met with the Department and the bursary Committee and after a long deliberation we decided the list can be in the office of the bursary administrator so that the money may be issued to the beneficiaries.

I see this as a positive development and a win-win consideration, especially considering the concerns we have previously raised regarding allocations through the Ward Development Fund.

Having said that, Hon. Speaker, the bursary programme continues to face numerous challenges because the requisitions received are underfunded.

For instance, the current requisition was KShs. 60,200,000 for bursaries. After taking away the MCAs' allocation amounting to KShs. 30,000,000, the county will remain with only KShs. 30,000,000.

This presents a major challenge because the amount will not be sufficient for the main county bursary allocation. The projected allocation was KShs. 82,000,000, but the department ended up receiving only KShs. 60,000,000.

Therefore, Hon. Speaker, we may have to return before this Hon House during the Supplementary Budget process so that additional funds can be sourced from other sectors to ensure that the bursary program is implemented as promised to the beneficiaries.

That is why I urge Hon. Members not to criticize the Chairperson because efforts have already been made to settle these concerns.

Going forward, I look forward to ensuring that the main bursary allocation is adequately funded so that beneficiaries are fully supported.

I further urge Hon. Members, during the Supplementary Budget process, to support the Department of Education because we all care about vulnerable students from our wards.

We do not want to continue making promises publicly without corresponding budgetary allocations approved by this Hon. House.

I therefore appeal to Members that during the Supplementary Budget process, they consider increasing allocations to the Department of Education.

QUESTIONS AND STATEMENTS

MCA, Loosuk Ward, (Hon Lenamparasio Phelix): Thank you so much Hon. Speaker let me take this opportunity to thank my senior for making sure that today my Statement has been responded to. I am so happy today but nevertheless I just have some very quick insights on this Statement. It is good that every Member has this copy so I think when so when I am highlighting some issues Members can just go back to the response because I have the Statement here, I think I am the only one with the Statement but for the response I think every other Member has.

Thank you so much Honourable Chair for this but let me very quickly just say this; I had asked only three questions regarding the implementation status of the bursary for the Financial Year 2025/2026. The first question was how much was allocated by the Department for the Bursary Fund for the Financial Year 2025/2026 inclusive of the wants and allocation. From the answer here, if you look at the first answer that is the first page goes to the second page the last paragraph; For the Financial Year 2025/2026, the County Assembly approved budgetary provisions under the Department of Education and Vocational Training intended to continue supporting needy learners through bursary assistance across all the wards of our County. A total of 98.3 million is what was approved, I can vividly remember that when we approved our budget here, the budget line for bursary was 98.3 Million but now there is something funny here that however the fund received was 60.2 million in February, 2026.

I have two questions on that issue;

One, why is it that the Department of Finance is not respecting the budget line for education? This House had approved a budget allocation of 98.3 Million, there was no supplementary to that effect but only giving the fund 60.2 Million. That is my first question but to the Department of Finance because they are the ones who issue funds.

While still on the issue on budget lines, if you go to page one, the good thing is that they had even talked about FY 2024/2025 of which I never asked but just have a look at it. I know that Financial Year 2024/25, the budget line for bursary was 123.4 million, that I can tell from my mind but they had only received Kshs. 68,758,637 and then they supplemented 30 million from the bursary to the health sector totaling to around 98.7 million. If you subtract 98.7 million from 123 Million, roughly you can get around maybe around some 20 something Million missing. You can see again the same thing applies. In as much as we want to make Education one of the strongest Departments we have in this county, the Department of Finance is demeaning the Department of Education I do not know if they are not interested with education in this County. This is the second Financial Year that the budget line for the bursary has not been respected, 2025 it was not respected and the second too.

The second question, so that I give Hon. Members time to react as well; there is this 60.2 million that the Department say they have received in February, 2026, now we are in March 10th in some few days we will be in the middle of March. I do not know if Members know here that we have

many Grade 10 pupils at home from poor families just because they have not gone to school. I just want to ask, from February to March, what was this money doing in the account and nobody even bothered to tell us that we had received this bursary? Should it be always that when we speak here or when we ask, that is the time that we will be told that on February, we had received 60.2 million? It was just about a week ago that our kids went back from midterm. I do not know how the Department will distribute this 30 million because that is what our ward fund is. As Honourable Chair was saying, if we take 30 million from our ward fund from 15 wards they will only remain with 30 million bearing in mind that we have like 15 thousand beneficiaries, I do not know how much a beneficiary will get from this 30 million that is remaining.

This Department should have taken into consideration the grade 10 learners. In Loosuk ward I know almost three or four of grade 10 pupils from very poor background who are at home. If I was given this allocation money earlier, I could have used it to make sure that those kids go to school even without uniform because I will just go and pay their fees. But money comes to the account, nobody bothers to tell us that this money is there so that we so timely disbursements. So that is another issue that should be taken very seriously.

The second question, when will the Department disburse the bursary funds to the respective beneficiaries? They have not even talked about when. The only good thing is that the Honourable Chair said he has shared through our Assembly page, a template for us to go and fill so that by Friday we take back to the Department, that is very good. The only thing that only thing that I have seen here is that the ban from the Controller of Budget was lifted and the Committee is in the process. I just wanted to know, this process. Where are they in this process? From the Bursary Act, it gives guidelines on how bursary should be distributed. Students should first of all apply, you should not be given bursary without applying first, so we should be told here if application was done so we are now maybe at integrating the information in the database; but they have not given any step in that process on where they are.

The last thing, number three; what assurance can the Department provide on timely disbursement bearing in mind that we only have three months to the end of the Financial Year. They have not talked about anything on assurance that they will give this House. Students were supposed to be apply for this bursary and their details need to be in the database, how will this application be done. I thought that during the midterm break, the Department could have announced so that the

students can apply for this bursary so that as they go back we just have to integrate their names in the database so that we give them these funds.

The last thing, if you look at the answers to the third question; that the first thing that the Department is doing to address the situation and to ensure that support to learners continue in a lawful and transparent manner. The first thing they said is that they are reviewing the County Bursary operational framework to ensure compliance with National public Finance Management Laws and regulations. I think we are less than a year when we had the review of the of the Bursary Fund. In that bursary fund, there are a lot of those frameworks. I can vividly remember that it was just recently, some months ago that we did the review of the County Bursary Fund Act, so what are they reviewing again? Because we already have that review and it can only be done after 10 years but we are less than a year in and they say that they are reviewing.

Let me leave there so that Members can again say something but at least I am happy today especially when I hear that by Friday I will be given my ward fund bursary. I will go and see how those four kids who have not reported to school will go back. Thank you Hon. Speaker.

Temporary Speaker, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): Thank you Hon. Phelix for the insights. Members I think we can input the Hon. Lenamparasio has brought some fresh issues that need fresh answers but nevertheless he is happy that of course bursary is in the process of being distributed as per your proposals and beneficiaries.

MCA Suguta Mar Mar Ward, (Hon. Leleruk James): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I stand also to thank the Chair for giving us this Report. This is the first time that we have seen a comprehensive Report has been brought, the questions that have been asked by the Hon. Lenamparasio have been partially or almost answered. I must commend the Office for trying their best. I am also very happy to hear that today the bursary for our kids, the ward fund will be available so that by Friday we will give out the names. I called Hon. Chair when I heard that the bursary has been given to the County but nothing has happened and going by what is happening in the Department, this is the time when the Department needs our support. I know when the first committee was in the office they saw the mess and we tried as an assembly to bring some sanity within that office.

I can certainly say that the Committee that is in that Department now have at least tried because even called the Chair to inform him about the bursary that has been available is 60.2 million. I know last time there was a confusion here and the reason why I said yes we can forego for now but we need to do a thorough audit on this bursary issue because the figures that being given conflict. We are being told that 68 Million has been disbursed 2024/2025 but when the students got the bursary last time I think it was 2026 and not 2025 and if you add 60 Million it will go roughly to 120 million. I remember even as a committee there is a day we did a supplementary of 30 million that we gave to the hospital, that means if 60 million, 68 million and 30 million it comes to almost 150 million.

The issue here is that we need to know how if there is any balance that has not yet been released. Is this the whole amount that we have received? Because I know that those universities and college students have not received the last bursary and now know if they have 30 million, that is where the issue is. What I can say is as an Assembly, all these kids belong to us and we know the grade 10 students have really suffered. Most of the kids went to school even without uniforms and maybe the Department through the Chair can tell us which kids are receiving these funds, is it the secondary or universities students so that our people also know when they will receive this bursary. I am however happy that I passed by the Samburu Guest House and I saw the whole Committee and they said they are on the making the decision to disburse this bursary. I urge the Honourable Members that as we are going to sit, we need also to focus on if this bursary helping our kids and whether we are allocating enough money required for our kids to go to school and if there is no other query on the controller of budget because last time the last time when we supplemented the 30 Million is when we got some issues with the controller of budget as we even thought that he will supplement. I think a few Hon. Members have decided to keep the bursary for this Financial Year but most of us put it to development and I think the bursary that we are receiving as Hon. Members of this house was a pending Bill of 24 million from the previous 2024/2025 Financial Year, that is bursary that I think maybe is the one we are getting also for the other Members is what they are making a total of 30 million.

We thank the Hon. Member, the Chair for the good stand and he stood with the Hon. Members and he said it is better for them to receive their share so that if the supplementary comes and they require the amount of money for our kids that is when we will sit and decide as an assembly but

what I am urging the honourable Members is to support this Department because it really has some messes. We can see they said 68 Million but I am see 60.2 million is what has been received and we do not know about the other 8 Million. The other day I saw the media said it is 71 million and now it is 60 million. That is the why I said the Chair will go back to the Department and we also want to enquire from the CEC to tell us exactly how much was allocated, how much has been disbursed and how much is remaining. Thank you Mr. Speaker.

Temporary Speaker, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): Thank you Hon. James. Hon. Esther Lenolkulal.

Specially Elected MCA, (Hon. Lenolkulal Esther): Asante Mheshimiwa Spika. Nachukua fursa hii kumshukuru Mungu kwa kutuwezesha kuwa hapa. Nashukuru Mungu kwa hoja hili la Mheshimiwa Lenamparasio. Nafikiri tutazungumza mambo ya Basari hadi tutakapo ondoka katika nyumba hii. Ninasikia pesa zilipatikana mwezi wa pili, swali langu kwa Mwenyekiti ili aifikishe kwa idara ni kuwa, ikiwa pesa zilipatikana mwezi wa pili, ni jambo lipi ambalo linafanya watoto wasipewe pesa hizo? Pili, tulikuwa na majina ya watoto ambao wanafaa kupata Basari, imekuaje tena tuandikishe majina yao upya? Ni kuwa wanatupa vitu inapopelekwa ama ni nini?

Msaada ambayo idara inaweza peana ni ya Basari, inafaa tuweke nguvu kuangalia watoto masikini. Nimewahi kusema hapa kuwa kuna akina mama wanaenda msitu kutengeneza makaa ili Watoto wapate kula ilhali kuna pesa hizi za Basari ambazo zinafaa kusomesha watoto wa masikini. Inakuaje ni kila siku tunarudia kuongea mambo ya Basari? Ni lini tutawacha kurudia mambo ya Basari na hawa Watoto kupewa nafasi ya kwanza kupewa pesa hizi. Hizi pesa hupatikana lakini imekuwa jambo ya aibu kwamba kila siku tunaongea mambo ya Basari. Hili litaisha lini au litafanyika lini ili hawa Watoto wa masikini waweze kupata elimu Mheshimiwa Spika.

Hivi majuzi watoto walipojiunga na Gredi ya 10 wazazi hawakua na uwezo wa kununua sera za shule lakini pesa hizi zingelipa karo yao na wazazi wajitahidi kununua sera. Tunashinda tukikaa hapa na pesa zinakuja na kukaa kwenye account, ama pesa za Basari hutumika kufanya biashara ndani ya account. Pesa zinapokuja na kukaa miezi miwili au tatu kwenye account naweza sema zinatumiwa kufanya biashara. Naomba Mwenyekiti ahimize idara iweze kupeana Basari kwa wakati unaofaa.

Saa hizi Samburu tunaongelea kila kitu, sio madawa, mashine, Basari kila jambo, tutakuwa tunafanya nini katika nyumba hili tukiwa waheshimiwa? Naomba tuangalie Watoto, akina mama na wazee ambao wameibiwa ng'ombe zao na Pokot ambao hawana chochote ya kusomesha watoto wanategemea hizi Basari na sisi tunakuja hapa kuongelelea mambo mengine ambayo hata haisaidii wananchi, asante Mheshimiwa Spika.

Temporary Speaker, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): Nashukuru sana Mheshimiwa Esther. We still have time before even the Chair for other Members to give their input. Hon. Jeremiah Leitoro.

MCA Elbarta Ward, (Hon. Leitoro Jeremiah): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I also want to take this opportunity to thank the Hon. Chair, Committee of Education for an adequate response. I think all of us are aware of the circumstances that made the disbursement of the bursary to have taken long. We all understand the reason as to why it has taken long. Until recently when the Controller of Budget approved the disbursement that is the time the County Government was able to get this bursary disbursement in the account.

There are some of the concerns pertaining to this bursary issue and one of the concerns and this issue has also been raised by the Auditor General in audit queries is on issues of double allocation. When I say so, we all understand that the Bursary Act state categorically that the persons who are responsible for disbursement of bursaries are Bursary Committees and even down to our Ward level we have Ward Level Bursary Committees. When we do the Bursary allocation the department usually allocate a certain amount for disbursement and we do also as a representative of the people through Ward Fund and we all understand Ward fund is just an agreement between us and the Governor.

When we do the allocation through Ward Fund and the Departments also does the same allocation you find those...you know these kids that we are serving, the same kids that the Department are giving this Bursary is also the same kids we are also giving this Bursary from our respective Wards. So, when the Department disburse and we also do so, an issue of double allocation occurs and these issues raise a lot of Audit queries and I think that is the reason as to why the chairperson read the response from the CEC stating that they are also working out to see how they can be able to work out a framework again as much as the review was done recently and Bursary Act. I think those are some of the challenges that need to be looked upon.

It is true actually out of the Ksh.60,000,200 amount that has already been released almost 30 million will go to Ward level, the allocation that was budgeted under Ward Fund. It is also true the 30 million will not be enough to actually settle all level from the tertiary level from the Certificate Diploma and Degree. From the communication that we had from the Department I think they needed around 60 something million if I am not wrong so that means the Department will be short again of around another 30 million; I think the Department will just be forced to disburse what is available because the initial plan of the Department was to give around Ksh.15,000 per student for those doing degree, Ksh.10,000 for those doing Diploma and around Ksh.7,500 for those doing Certificate courses so they will be forced to actually lower the allocation to various levels of tertiary education.

This is because the other alternative is for the Department to consider having a Supplementary so that the amount can be lifted from 30 million to the required that is around 60 million and if that will not be possible then it means they will have to work on what is available. I think the Education sector is not the only one that has been affected, we have challenges across Departments and during our last Supplementary challenges pertaining to health care service delivery necessitated the Supplementary because initially we thought perhaps maybe this bursary will not be approved by the Controller of Budget and actually some of us were waiting for a second Supplementary if in the case that the Controller of Budget will not approve then we were actually to Supplement this too to go do some development in terms of even construction of ECD centers, kitchen and etc.

By good luck or again unfortunately the approval came when already Supplementary has been done so the damage is already there. I do not think we can do anything now. If the 30 million was Supplemented from the bursary and it went to health care service delivery it is still a win-win situation. I know my Honorable Chair will not agree on that but at the end of the day the health care was somehow also compromised but we thank God because we still have a leeway for the second Supplementary so that we can be able to actually have this disbursement in the amount that will be acceptable thank you Mr. Speaker.

Temporary Speaker, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): Thank you Hon. Jeremiah Leitoro. Somehow this is what we want to address the issue, some clarity, what you know and all that. Any other person? Chairman you will have your space, a whole hour if needed.

Specially Elected MCA, (Hon. Lenamatiyo Silapia): Thank you Mr. Speaker. I also rise to raise my concern on the same issue of bursary. The last Financial Year we went through a lot of issues on the bursary issue. The allocation for bursary for that Financial Year was not completely disbursed during that Financial Year and in this current year what I am seeing in this Statement from the response of the Department of Education that the Controller of Budget has approved 98 million but what they have received is 60 million, that is on the month of February and up to date even the Department did not tell us the way forward on how they are going to distribute this 60 million.

That shows that the Department are not serious on what they are doing, because if they were serious they could have told us that the last financial Year they distributed the bursary for the secondary student but this year now they do something for the tertiary universities and colleges. But they did not say so and they are telling us that they are putting measures in place to make sure that they implement the reviewed Act that we reviewed some months ago. The outcry is high within our communities across all the nine Departments we have; there is not even a single Department that we can say we are doing better on this.

Such sensitive Department like Education bursary, ECD feeding programs, Health, all of them are facing a lot of challenges. When we are allocating money and we cannot account for those monies. I think this is the right time now to call upon that Department so that we can even advise on how they are going to disburse this 60 million, because a week ago our County was facing the dry seasons even taking our livestock to the market could not be bought because of the situation while the County says they have no money and they did not receive bursary now that they have received the bursary but they do not know what to do with the 60 million. I think this in order that we call that Department and let us do something on the 60 million.

Temporary Speaker, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): The Hon. Member Silapia, I think it is going to be out of Order to say they do not know what to do. The Chairman can give us the guideline.

They know exactly what to do and maybe the Chairman will meet. It was not part of the question so please let us also not anticipate or bring out what is not there. The Department as per the Chairman is going to explain how. You would rather say how they will but not, “they don’t know”.

Specially Elected MCA, (Hon. Lenamatiyo Silapia): Okay let me withdraw. Thank you, Mr. Speaker. You know if the Chairman would have known how the Department knew how to disburse the bursary we would not be here discussing the bursary issue, they could have done it before. Mr. Speaker I have a right because we have people borrowing money from us so that their children can go to school and if this money has been received on February they could have done something. Our people would not have the idea that we are going to get bursary if they only knew we had 60 million in the account. I am not wrong when I say so because if they have 60 million and they have not done anything until now...*aaai*, thank you.

Temporary Speaker, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): Thank you, I do not think it is in order for me actually to, I do not have the mandate to obstruct, but some information as misleading, and maybe want to have in this part of the House correct information, which maybe the Chairman has. As a speaker also, of this session, I consulted with the little time, and I will give also some consultation information.

The Chairman, sir, before we get out of the topic.

Chairperson Committee on Education and Vocational Training, (Hon. Lorunyei Lawrence): Ahsante sana Mheshimiwa Spika. Wacha nizungumze kwa lugha la Kiswahili.

Bwana Spika, jambo la kwanza bajeti ya 2024/2025 vile Mheshimiwa Phelix MCA Loosuk Ward amesema, KShs. 78 million approved, but the bursary kit got the KShs. 68 million, which they disbursed. Do you see now? The KShs.30 million, ni ile nini? Ni ile mulipeana kwa Health. Nafikiria it is very clear from there now.

Alafu kukuja 2025/2026, 2025/2026, ile bajeti tulifanya mwezi wa sita, tuli approve Kshs. 98 lakini ile iliingia kwa akaunti ya bursary ni KShs. 60 million umeelewa sasa? Kwasababu hiyo ndio iliingia. Tuseme nini, kwanza; vurugu ilianza mwezi wa Januari kwasababu kulikuwa na ile

circular ya Controller of Budget kusema kwamba kaunti haiwezi kueana bursary, ndio tukaingia mambo ya kureview ilituweze ndio turekebishe na regulations za Finance Act vile inasema.

Tulipo tia saina mkataba wa intergovernmental agreement ndio tukapata pesa mwezi wa pili, na sasa tuko mwezi wa tatu, sasa tukisema mwezi wa tatu pesa zilizoingia kwa mfuko wa bursary au akaunti ya bursary ni shilingi milion 6.2 sio milioni 98, umelewa sasa? We are talking about kile kimeingia kwa akaunti ya busary.

Mulipeana kama majina mbeleni, sasa ndio tukasema kwamba kwasababu confirmation ya hizo majina na ndio nakeeana tablet muandike nini, sasa kama mukona hizo copies si mujaze basi tu ifike kabala ijuma alafu pesa iende, mumelewa.

Tunataka kwamba atatukipeleka leo pesa ziwe tayari wana process kesho. Kwa hivyo sisi ndio tulisukuma kwasababu alikuwa wanasema wanataka haraka.

Maneno ya double allocation, unajua kwatika teknolojia ya siku hizi, huwezi kujiandikisha mara mbili, ikionekana mara mbili inasema ni mara mbili, sasa hiyo ndio inaleta masawali, tulisema watakaa chini wasuluishe haya maneno, thank you Hon. Speaker.

Temporary Speaker, (Hon. Lemoosa Jonathan): Thank you Hon. Chair, reading from the mood of the House, and, especially the Hon. Phelix, there is some light of what ofcourse we are trying to put forward just to help the Chair.

I was also trying to consult for facts, because in this House we need some facts. Utaniruhusu pia mimi nizungumze kwa lugha ya Kiswahili. Nimejaribu kuafikia Waziri na Mwenyekiti ya kamati ya basari na wamesema kwamba pesa ya basari imepokelewa katika akaunti mnamo tarehe 24/2/2026 and if we shall need some satisfaction, tutauliza hata hiyo deposit.

They have told me na iko hapa, mwezi wapili ilikuwa na siku ishirini na nane kwa hivyo kwa hivyo ukijumulisha siku nne na siku hizi kumi sio mwezi. Hiyo pesa ya kusaidia wanafunzi iko katika akiba yao kwa siku kumi na nne. That is what I have confirmed for clarity.

Number two, it so happened Chairperson aliiitwa na kamati, inaitwa axillary information, nikaenda na eye kama witness, na Chairperson naomba utaniwia radhi kama nasema uongo tafadhali sema mheshimiwa spika wa atamu hii, unasema uongo.

Walisema kwamba ile fedha baada kutoa ile ya waheshimiwa zile zitakazo baki wataea colleges, universities, na diploma na certificate, Chairperson I think that is what we weretold. Walisema kwa ile ya Ward Fund, hiyo haina kipimo unaweza kupea grade eight. But, their concern vile Chair alisema ni mambo ya double allocation, mwanafunzi mmoja anaata kwa hii nyingine na anaata kwa hii nyingine ndio inaleta audit query ambayo alikuwa wanasema kwamba kama tunaweza leta hizo majina na mwanafunzi awe anafaidi mara mbili wampatie cheki moja and I think that is what they want to say they are trying to review how we can manage.

Walihaidi Chairperson kwamba watakuwa na kikao na waheshimiwa waone namna vile tunaeza songa mbele bila kuwa na shida. Lakini kwasababu hii ni kikao ya nyumba maybe baadae anaweza kuwa na hilo normal talks aweze kutuelekeza.

Yale ambayo nilikuwa nataka kuelekeza ni kwamba, wanasema kuna wale walileta majina kitambo kidogo na labda wanataka kusahihisha lakini kwa wale ambao wametuma majina zao na wanasema ni hayo na ziko kwa data bank na hakuna mabadiliko. It depends on individuals Hon member.

I think these are some of the things, ofcourse mimi sitaweza kusema hakuna kasoro hapa na pale, lakini hii inataka wakati fulani tuketi chini wasababu mheshimiwa Phelix ameweka dosari haya na yale, lakini kwa hakika pamoja na wizara ya fedha, yetu na wale wengine ili tuweze kujua ni nini inafanyika na ni nini haswa tunahitaji kusaidia idara hii ya elimu Samburu kwasababu kulikuwa na ile hofu ya controller kusema kwamba hamna ruhusa ya kupeana fedha ya elimu, hii ilikuwa changamoto n ahata mara nyingi nilikuwa nakumbuka Mheshimiwa Jeremiah hata na mimi nilikuwa nasema tutoe hii pesa tujenge shule za chekechea.

But God is good and kind and merciful, tukona hio nafasi pia na vile dada yangu Esther alisema tusaidie hawa watoto kidogo waweze kujimudu. Our biggest worry here na hata Chairman can be the witness, I asked them “kuna watoto ambao wasipopewa fedha na County na mheshimiwa, hawatenda shule”. Kidogo naona vile Chairman alisema wacha tupatane kama kamati na

waheshimiwa tuone how we can manage the challenges ya Auditor kwasababu hiyo ndio changamoto kubwa.

Let us see if we can get fast than them and see how we can help kwasababu hizi pesa pia zikona njia za kukagua lakini nafurahi kwamba hii fedha ikakaa kwa muda mrefu kwa akaunti ya kamati ni wiki mbili na haya mengine yote, mipango yako kwasababu walisema watapea treasury. The big challenge here is grade eight how will they benefit? Because I am also very sure, because I am one of the parents' representative.

Juzi tukiwa nyumbani kidogo, haswa mnamo tarehe 5/1/2026 unawezapata wazazi kama ishirini wanakuja na kusema “nikona mtoto grade ten anataka sera za shule, godoro anataka sijui nini” so, wacha tu Chairman atuelekeza labda leo ama kesho tuweze kukutana na tuweze kujua how we will manage ourselves especially kwa double allocation.

Thank you so much msheshimiwa. I think nobody anaweza kukandamiza mtu na haki yake kwasababu tuko hapa kuwakilisha wananchi.

Thank you so much I think we have no any other business. I think we can abide and comply by the House rules. Thank comply by the house rules. Thank you.
